ANGELOLOGY, SATANOLOGY, DEMONOLOGY

Arnold Fruchtenbaum Week 1 July 4-8 Are you puzzled by the references to different types of angels and demons in the Bible? This course will equip you with a thoroughly biblical and Messianic Jewish understanding of the origin, nature, capabilities, and roles of celestial beings from the time of Creation through the Last Days to their final destiny.

MESSIAH IN THE TABERNACLE/TEMPLE

Steve Shermett Week 1 & 2 July 4 - 15 God gave His people instructions how to make structures (Tabernacle/Temple) by which He would dwell amongst them and through which His people would worship Him. But was it more than that? Was there a deeper symbolic intention in the design? Learn how these historic structures pointed God's people to deeper heavenly truths.

PERSONAL ESCHATOLOGY

Arnold Fruchtenbaum Week 2 July 11 - 15 Is the soul immortal? What is the future of the soul? Where do we go immediately upon death? Is Hades different from Hell? Find the biblical answers in this complete course about our destiny beyond the grave.

ECCLESIOLOGY (DOCTRINE OF THE CHURCH) Mottel Baleston Weeks 3-4 July 18 – 29 What is the universal church and how is the local church different from it? What is the biblical pattern of leadership for the local church? Is church membership a biblical requirement? Is a Messianic congregation the

same as a church? This course in a key area of Systematic Theology answers your questions thoroughly and biblically.

HIGHLIGHTS OF EZEKIEL

Arnold Fruchtenbaum Weeks 3-5 July 18 – Aug. 5 The Messianic prophecies come alive, the puzzling symbolic visions and parables become clearer, and the prophet's strange actions understandable in this detailed study through this often-overlooked prophet to exiled Jews in Babylon.

ISRAELOLOGY (DOCTRINE OF ISRAEL)

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LIFE OF MESSIAH

Arnold Fruchtenbaum Weeks 3-5 July 18 – Aug. 5 This summary course on the Life of Messiah is required for all those attending the 3 week program for the first time. Based on the Ariel's Harmony of the Gospels textbook, this class walks you chronologically through the four Gospels. It focuses on the events in the life of Messiah from a Jewish perspective, shedding light on the Jewish theology and customs that were a daily part of Jewish life in the first

THE BOOK OF ACTS

Weeks 3-5 Greg Hagg July 18 – Aug. 5 Was the Church a split from Judaism? How and why did Gentiles get accepted into the Church? How did the Church manage to spread so quickly? This study of the book of Acts explores the key events in the Jewish beginning and spread of the Church to answer these and other

questions, and highlights the relevance of these answers for the Messianic movement of today.

DESIGN FOR DISCIPLESHIP

Mottel Baleston Week 4 Aug. 1-5 Salvation requires a simple act of faith. Discipleship requires a total commitment. Through this course, learn how to become a committed disciple of the Messiah.

THE LIFE OF MESSIAH

Arnold Fruchtenbaum Week 6 Aug. 8-12 In this classic one-week intensive course, drill down through all four gospels chronologically with the help of Ariel's Harmony of the Gospels textbook. Gain a deeper understanding of the words and deeds of the Messiah by understanding the background of Jewish theology, customs, and socio-political perspectives in which he ministered.

THE JEWISH PEOPLE IN THE BOOK OF ROMANS Mottel Baleston Week 7 Aug. 15-19 The Book of Romans is an overview of New Testament biblical doctrine, yet we easily miss the core teaching that surfaces again and again in this epistle: the continuing role of the Jewish people in the plan of God for the world. Understanding this truth in Romans will ensure an understanding of the whole story of the Bible.

THE DOCTRINE OF MAN

Arnold Fruchtenbaum Week 7 Aug. 15-19 This new course for the Program of Messianic Jewish Studies investigates from a Messianic Jewish perspective God's plan for humanity: from creation to the fall into sin, to redemption, to the final state of mankind in glorification. With this study you will come to a better

understanding of your place and purpose in this present time of history.

POST MOSAIC JEWISH HOLY DAYS

Mottel Baleston Week 8 Aug. 22-26 Should the Church be participating in the observances given in Leviticus 23? Should Christians care about Jewish Holy Days such as Hanukkah, Purim, Tisha B'Av and others? Explore these special days within the context of New Testament Grace and see the traditions and ritual items demonstrated.

THE DOCTRINE OF SIN

Arnold Fruchtenbaum Week 8 Aug. 22-26 In this course you will discover the Messianic Jewish understanding of the origin of evil and of sin, and investigate the theological controversy known as "original sin." You will learn to distinguish biblically the sin nature from personal sin and how practically to deal with both. This course will give special attention to the real meaning of "the unpardonable sin".

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

Each week, classes begin on Monday morning and end on Friday evening. During Weeks 1 and 2, there will be four one-hour class sessions during the mornings and in the evenings. In Weeks 3 through 6 there will be five classes in the mornings and evenings. The Weeks 7 and 8 session is like the first with four classes. Those coming for the special Labor Day Weekend program should arrive in time for a delightful opening Shabbat meal. A leisurly pace of only 3 classes each day beginning Saturday makes the entire time a holiday to remem-

Each class session is one hour in length and begins with a brief time of worship. However, the Highlights of Life of Messiah during Weeks 3-5 runs 75 minutes daily, and is required for those attending the program for the first time. The complete Life of Messiah course in Week 6 has 5 classes daily. The schedule is designed to maximize the teaching time during the day, yet provide ample time for fun activities, fellowship, as well as relaxation. Thus, each afternoon is open time to enjoy hiking, recreation at Trout Pond, other local attractions, to simply relax and enjoy the beauty of the campus, or to take time with the Lord in personal study and prayer.

Each week comes to a fitting climax in a special Shabbat dinner followed by the teaching service. Saturday is a free day for those continuing in their studies the following week, or departure day for those not continu ing. On Sunday mornings, there is a time to gather for worship led by Ariel staff members and students. If you play a musical instrument, please bring it and share your talent on Wednesday evening "fun and talent" night or by assisting those who lead the worship times. Also, impromptu music always makes the Saturday and Sunday evening lakeside cookouts to be very special occasions indeed.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH PROGRAM

While the adults are attending the teaching sessions, the children and youth are also learning and being discipled by carefully selected committed staff using age appropriate settings and activities. Many of the young people have indicated that this time at Shoshanah is a highlight of their year. Please note that during non-teaching times, parents must take responsibility for their children.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Varied types of accommodations are available, from en-suite rooms to family cabins, RV spots, and camping facilities. The Administration strives to accommodate individuals and families to make the most efficient use of the facilities. All accommodations are available on a first-come, first-served basis, with early registrants receiving preference for accommodations and dates attendance. 
